MCHAMARA IN VIETNAM: The United States Defence Secretary, accompanied by a team of experts, arrived in Saigon on October 10. His visit was described as a study tour. He denied a Chinese allegation that the US intended to invade North Vietnam, but did not rule out the possibility of ground forces penetrating the demilitarised zone. Mr McNamara spent the morning with General Westmoreland (4th), the US Commander.

ANOTHER RUBENS DISCOVERED: A major work by Rubens has been discovered by Christie's — the second in five weeks. It is an oil sketch, or modello, for his painting Samson and Delilah, and is on a wood panel measuring 20 1/2 inches by 22 inches.
